





Choice of Examiners for the *Staatsexamen*, Spring 2021

Candidates for the *Staatsexamen* in spring 2021 may now register their preferred examiners via the English department's [online form](#). The deadline for this registration is **31 May, 2020**. In June, qualified examiners will review all submissions and determine their assignments based on submitted preferences. Candidates can expect to be informed by 20 June who their assigned examiner will be.

The application phase for our M.A. programs is in full swing. Prospective students have until **15 June, 2020** to apply for any of the following programs:


- English Literatures and Literary Theory (MELLIT)

ERASMUS+ VIRTUAL EXCHANGE: Debate Exchange Activity

The ERASMUS+ Virtual Exchange now offers a debate exchange activity, bringing young people from different backgrounds together to develop parliamentary debate skills with the support of a network of trained debate team leaders, fostering listening and understanding through advocacy training.

The aim of the Debate Team Leader Training is to enhance young people's parliamentary debate skills, such as: building arguments, active listening and rebuttal, organisation of speeches and the use of a specific format for discussion. Participants are first taught to listen, understand, and absorb what others in the group are saying before responding to the messages being relayed.

After the training, team leaders can deliver a training for peers in their communities, aiming to form a local debate team. Finally, team leaders can register their self-trained teams in a cross-cultural [Online Debate](#) (another session of the activity).
