The linguistic *Proseminar* *Digital Discourse* by Dr. Katharina Ehret has been added to the summer semester course program!

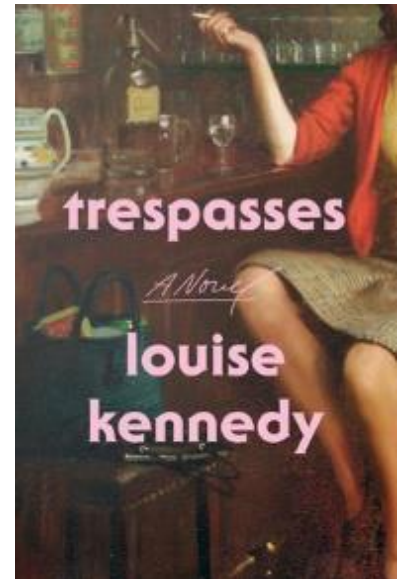
## Contemporary Literature Book Club | Louise Kennedy, *Trespases* (2022)

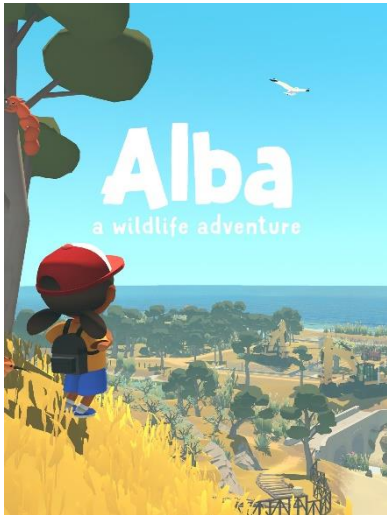
