Inhalte

Fourteen years after, 9/11 seems a traumatic event of a remote past—the first in a series of cataclysms, which have so forcefully come to characterize the still young 21st century: the ‘war on terror,’ curtailing of civil liberties, increase of surveillance, mass incarceration, the greatest financial collapse since the Great Depression, all undergirded by the increasingly pervasive rule of a neoliberal ‘market rationality’ and a spreading sense of powerlessness and exhaustion. We will examine the political, economic and social crises of the Bush and Obama Era through cultural forms ranging from contemporary novels, films, and television series to social media. Topics to be considered include American exceptionalism and Obama’s presidency, the inequality discourse, the media in the era of austerity, the 9/11 inspired neuro-realism of a Richard Powers and the counterfactual revenge fantasy of a Quentin Tarrantino, the neo-naturalism of David Simon’s *The Wire*, the striking shortness of Don DeLillo’s *Point Omega*, Richard Ford’s concern with authenticity in *The Lay of the Land* and Siri Hustvedt’s with feminism and autism in her most recent novel *The Blazing World*.

Inhalte

The date 1066 may be the metonymic label for the political and cultural cesura caused by the Norman invasion of England. Hence, for over 200 years English largely disappeared as a written language in general and as the language of written poetry in particular.

The class will give a critical insight into the immediate as well as long-term cultural and – in particular – literary consequences of 1066 and the reemerging of English as a literary language after ca. 1200. The aim of the class is not so much to illustrate that English after all 'replaced' French but rather to show that, for one thing, English poetry very much profited from its French models. Moreover it will discuss how English poetry gained a standing in the 14th century that could compete with that of continental vernacular poetry.

The course is designed to introduce students to the broader range of Britain's theatrical work after 1945 up to the contemporary period. With the devastating effects of WW II still looming large over British people, post-war dramatists sought new ways to express their disaffection with or outright rejection of outlived ideologies as well as overly conventionalized dramatic resources. While the dramas to be discussed span across a variety of themes, from existentialist philosophy to critical consumerism, the class will strive to connect the plays by means of the overarching loss of grand narratives for many writers after '45. Ideally, the class will apply and develop basic concepts of drama analysis as familiar from the Introduction to Literary Studies as well as make students recognize the ongoing topicality of post-war concerns for present social issues.

Lernziele

Students taking this course will be introduced to the work of one of the most canonical American authors. In addition, they will gain basic insights into philosophical idealism. Finally, since transcendentalism amounts to the American form of romanticism, students will rehearse and expand on their knowledge of this crucial and very rich literary and philosophical period.

Inhalte

Ralph Waldo Emerson is the most influential proponent of transcendentalism, antebellum America's major philosophical and literary movement. Sparked by Emerson's ground-breaking interventions, transcendentalism generated significant contributions to such diverse fields as politics, economics, education and pedagogy, and religious thought. In pursuing these wide-ranging interests, Emerson and his fellow transcendentalists contributed to and developed a plethora of genres, from the essay to poetry, from the lecture to travel writing, from the sermon to literary criticism.

In this course we will read and closely scrutinize a cross-section of Emerson's prolific oeuvre, with a particular emphasis on his nature writing and his philosophical commitments and presuppositions (Kant; German Idealism; Coleridge; mysticism). In this vein, we will inquire how Emerson conceived of the relation between nature and metaphysics, that is, matter and spirit, and we will trace how his metaphysical views relate to his more concrete forays into the realms of the social and political.

We will start with Petersen's blockbuster ›Troy‹ (2004) and then work our way back in time, looking at the discovery and conquest of the Americas as well as Rome's North African ambitions, and finally zooming in on the entanglements of power, honour, love and empire in Shakespeare's ›Antony and Cleopatra‹.

Inhalte

Situations of conquest have challenged the European imagination for centuries, both as a setting of cultural contact and discovery and as an archetypical case of extreme violence. This course will explore representations of conquest on screen, on stage and in the novel, comparing how the events and figures involved are shaped and (re-)evaluated in the shifting aesthetic, political and social contexts from Renaissance London to the present day.

Lehrmethoden

Students will engage critically with three novels — *Jane Eyre*, *Wuthering Heights*, and *The Tenant of Wildfell Hall* — and study various aspects of the Victorian novel (form and structure, narrative point of view, plot and character development, language and style). We will explore the relationship between biography and literature, gender and writing, and canonical and popular literary status. We will also raise questions about the interpretation and transmission of the Brontë myth by looking at excerpts from Elizabeth Gaskell's major biography, *The Life of Charlotte Brontë*, a modern film adaptation of *Jane Eyre* (2011, dir. Fukunaga) and post-colonial forms of resistance to the master narratives, such as Jean Rhys' *Wide Sargasso Sea* and Maryse Condé's *Windward Heights*.

Inhalte

The Brontë sisters are among the most enduringly popular Victorian authors, yet their critical reputation remains ambiguous. This course will focus on the individual achievements of the three Brontë sisters, Charlotte, Emily, and Anne, and their impact on 20th and 21st century fiction, film, and popular culture.

Lehrmethoden

Both conquest and subjugation are matters of Hispanic memory, leading to a paradoxical sentiment of feeling ‘other’ as well as part of mainstream U.S. American culture. This has complicated the relation to the larger society and affected the articulation of cultural forms, regional images, and ethnic identities. The course offers a range of primarily narrative texts that witness the ongoing negotiations of difference and belonging informed by the historic experience of U.S. Hispanics. We will examine texts which juxtapose Hispanic and Anglo American perspectives on the region, which arise from the experience of dislocation and migration, or which strive to give political and cultural movements literary form. In addition to fictional texts, our reading will include documents and essays that reflect on the historical conundrums U.S Hispanics have had to face and the political dynamic arising from their specific situation.

Hispanic Americans have become the largest minority group and Spanish is widely heard throughout the United States, yet the many facets of U.S. Hispanic cultural production and history are less familiar outside the country than their sociological presence and political impact might suggest. With a focus on the region commonly referred to as the American Southwest, the course traces the development from “Conquistadors to Chicanos” and from El Norte to the borderlands from colonial accounts of the conquest of New Mexico to postmodern renditions of the borderlands experience.

Lehrmethoden

The course is designed to provide a rough survey of American economic history. Its main focus, however, is on the ideological impact of economic phenomena. Therefore, it explores e.g. slavery or Agrarianism for its effects on the making of a new nation. Enterprise and self-conception have been closely intertwined in American culture, as the writings of Benjamin Franklin, the contrasting ideas of Jefferson and Hamilton or the politics of Andrew Jackson show. They lastingly shaped ideas of the United States as a nation and of the individual's contribution to it. Reading documents and literary representations of business ideals and of the protagonists of business culture, we will explore the origins of cultural myths like the 'self-made man,' or inspect the rise 'from rags to riches' for its lasting significance for the symbolic system that is American culture. How powerful is the assumption that "the business of America is business" and where is it at work culturally?

Inhalte

The 1992 campaign slogan "It's the economy, stupid!" summarizes a trend in thinking about business and attributes master narrative status to recent developments in economic history. It tends to conceal that beyond being a means of exchange of goods within or among societies, business and 'the economy' ought to be read as a powerful purveyor of cultural meanings, values and social aspirations. From Puritan beginnings to the era of neo-liberal capitalism – taking into perspective the individual, the community, the nation – the course traces the interrelations of economic and cultural history in the United States.

Inhalte

This seminar explores the relationship between text and world in Renaissance England (c.1500-1630). How did early modern texts go about describing the ‘real’ world? Did they make attempts to be ‘realistic’, were they self-consciously fictional, or both? How did literary works manage to talk about the period’s rapidly changing domestic, urban, and global contexts? We will also ask what it means for literature to become textual, to be transposed from a predominantly oral into a written and/or printed medium: How did the textualization of literature affect the functions and features of narrative? How did early modern readers respond to new material print products (such as the Miscellany and the almanac) and to the displacement of manuscript culture by (what Peter Stallybrass has called) “the navigable book”? We will range across different genres but special emphasis will fall on narrative prose and drama.

We will read the following dramas in their entirety: Thomas Dekker, *The Shoemaker’s Holiday* (1599), William Shakespeare’s *The Tempest* (1610-11), and Philip Massinger’s colonial extravaganza *The Renegado* (1630). We will read excerpts from Thomas More’s *Utopia* (1516), Thomas Lodge’s *Rosalynde* (1590), Thomas Nashe’s *The Unfortunate Traveller* (1594), Francis Bacon’s essays, Donne’s *Devotions Upon Emergent Occasions* (1624), and other works. Our readings will be accompanied by a small selection of recent secondary literature on the material text cultures of the period.

Lehrmethoden

Via both critical and fictional writings of leading realists such as William Dean Howells, Mark Twain, and Henry James, this course sets out to reconstruct the democratic aspirations of American literary realism as well as the means and ends sought to realized them. But it also wants to contextualize these developments: as part of a broader spirit of reform to which social documentation and 'muckraking' journalism also belonged, and bound up with the professionalization of literary production consolidating at this time—and largely dominated by male writers. Regionalism, an early form of American realism, is of special interest, then: for featuring many women writers, among them Kate Chopin and Willa Cather, who used it to thematize the conflict between assigned gender roles and their own longings and desires, one important outcome being the rise of a 'New Woman' literature. The programmatic distance to the metropolitan centers of American life (where society was formed and manners were strictly enforced) gave rise to characters more eccentric, sensual, and 'undisciplined' than Victorian America demanded, and a vision of American democracy potentially more open and inclusive than that of their mostly male, urban-based counterparts.

Inhalte

Emerging in the second half of the nineteenth century in response to a world shaken up by the Civil War and the industrial revolution, realism no less then revolutionized American literature. While many people (including the cultural establishment) experienced the vast transformations of their time with a deep sense of crisis, realist writers thought of them as a specific potential of American society—a potential in need to be tamed and cultivated. It is to this end that literature had to fundamentally modernize itself. Realism tried to accomplish this through its commitment to truthfully depict the social world as it presented itself to individual and collective experience (which it combined with a bold rejection of any metaphysical reality beyond that world). This way, it wanted to courage and instruct its readers to deal with the problems of their own contemporaneity.

Lehrmethoden

In this course we will read a selection of novels that deal with the phenomenon of racial passing as a mirror or projection screen of American race relations at their time. Starting with Charles Chesnutt's *The House Behind the Cedars* (1900), the first novel by an African American author, who was himself 'white' enough to pass, we will work our way across the twentieth century by reading two modernist novels, Nella Larsen's *Passing* (1929), and William Faulkner's *Light in August* (1934), and then leap to the post-Civil Right era with Danzy Senna's *Caucasia* (1998), Coleson Whitehead's *The Intuitionist* (1999), and Philip Roth's *The Human Stain* (2000). Besides tracing the coercive power of the colorline, our main objective will be to study the intersecting renderings of 'race' and 'gender' in each novel, and assess the hierachizing work performed by them in the fictional worlds in which they operate. How is passing gendered in our novels, and what effects to this have on the individuals and communities depicted in them? Do the novels imagine ways to expose, resist, or remodel the normalizing forces of 'race' and 'gender' that they portray through the practice of passing? How do these imaginary acts inform and/or contradict one another?

Inhalte

American race relations are ruled by the 'colorline'—the imaginary boundary that often violently separates 'black' and 'white' population. Racial passing designates a practice in which light skinned African Americans cross this line to escape racism, and enhance their possibilities of self-realization and social advancement—at great risk, and to the expense of giving up their ties to the 'black' community. Deeply engrained into the troubled history of American race relations, in which the collective 'body' of the slave population increasingly 'whitened' as masters sexually exploited their female slaves to increase their labor force, yet one drop of 'black' blood was enough to keep a person on the 'other,' de-humanized and disenfranchised side of the colorline, racial passing is a quintessentially American phenomenon. Yet while bound to operate in absolute secrecy in the social world, and thus forced to confirm rather than challenge the racist assumption on which the colorline rests, works of fiction have continuously been drawn to it to disclose this secrecy as a powerful instrument of social critique.

Inhalte

In the tempestuous history of the Irish state in the 20th century, playwrights have taken an important part. From the beginning of the century, they were involved in and responded to the nationalist project – presenting, questioning and negotiating old stereotypes and new models of ‘Irishness’ in their works. This seminar will focus primarily on plays from the 1980s and 90s, a period which saw violent conflict as well as the promise of reconciliation. We will discuss how works by Brian Friel, Tom Murphy, Frank McGuinness, Martin McDonagh and Marina Carr employ a broad range of dramatic devices to stage Irish life and history – and we will also look at the various ways in which these works look back to one of the most influential plays in the Irish tradition, John Millington Synge’s *The Playboy of the Western World* (1907).

In this seminar we will consider different genres of Shakespeare plays in context with other playwrights of the time, in particular Christopher Marlowe and an anonymous playwright who dealt with Tudor history. Lehrmethoden

In this master seminar, we will investigate into these literary discourses focussing in particular on class, caste, religion and gender. We will start with Mulk Raj Anand's classical novella *Untouchable*, then move on to Arundhati Roy's *The God of Small Things* and conclude with Kiran Desai's *The Inheritance of Loss* and Aravind Adiga's *The White Tiger*. Depending on the availability, we will also look at translations from vernacular Indian languages.

As our seminar touches on a number of ethico-political and transcultural issues, we will also discuss classic as well as recent approaches in postcolonial theory, feminism, and ethical theory (Nussbaum / Sen). Therefore, this seminar carries a heavy reading load.

Inhalte

India is often seen "under Western eyes" (Mohanty) and thus depicted as backward, unjust, and sexist. Indeed, for the writer Shauna Singh Baldwin, India is "the worst country in which to be a woman." Such allegations, however, erase the many progressive voices within Indian culture, and the plethora of socio-critical Indian fiction, in which social injustice is denounced vociferously.

Inhalte

Much of recent cultural and literary scholarship is concerned with showing how ideology works through novels, movies, photographs, and other forms of our culture to position us as subjects. This course sets out to look beyond this allegedly mechanical understanding of culture by exploring the question why we are drawn to these artifacts in the first place. Why do we like to engage ourselves with them and the worlds and meanings they unfold, knowing that they are made-up, and in that sense not real? Why do we even turn to some texts, films, images, or narratives over and over again? In what ways are they related to, and entangled with the world of our everyday? And how do the experiences we make with them affect and pervade our lives beyond the invented worlds to which they are prone to take us?

In dealing with these questions we will touch upon the social and anthropological functions of culture, and the different notions of the aesthetic engrained into them. Our readings will take us to Plato and Aristotle, whose aesthetic theories prepared the grounds for further discussion of the matter, and to 20th century thinkers such as Mikhail Bakthin, Walter Benjamin, John Dewey, Martin Heidegger, Roland Barthes, Peter Brooks, Wolfgang Iser, Winfried Fluck, Rita Felski, Vivian Sobchack, and Hans Belting. Based on these readings, we will trace our guiding question through a range of intellectual traditions (among them pragmatism, phenomenology, existentialism, psychoanalysis and reception aesthetics) and compare their different agendas, premises, and blind spots.

Inhalte

This seminar takes on the decades after World War II, for they have marked a period of significant cultural and sociopolitical change in the US. The roughly twenty years between 1945 and 1965 mark an era that is shaped by rapid economic growth, ideological framing and political persecution, individual and collective self-empowerment, suburban housing development, urban decay, a massive influx of university students on the GI Bill, and, not least, (post-)modern experiments in art, literature and architecture.

We will concern ourselves with the latter in order to determine and ascertain the cultural climate and its means of spawning cultural change. From Jackson Pollock and Lee Krasner to Edward Hopper in painting, from Ralph Ellison to Vladimir Nabokov in literature, from Howard Hawks to Douglas Sirk in film, from Allen Ginsberg to Betty Friedan in poetry and criticism, this seminar will look at a variety of cultural voices and texts that deal with the time's radical individualization, fragmentation and acceleration in and of the world. Through these texts, we will encounter the post-war years in the United States as the dawn of the technological age and the pathway into a multicultural society, as the capitalist turn to neoliberalism and the paranoid anxiety in the face of the communist threat.

Inhalte

The study of "varieties of English around the world," the "New Englishes" or "World Englishes" emerged at the intersection of dialectology, sociolinguistics and historical linguistics in the early 1980s and has become one of the most vibrant sub-fields of English linguistics. Work in this tradition has made an enormous contribution to our understanding of the linguistic aftermath of colonialism. Among its lasting legacies are frameworks such as Kachru's (1992) classification of World Englishes into the Inner Circle of native speakers, the Outer Circle of second-language users, and the Expanding Circle of foreign-language learners, or Schneider's (2007) "Dynamic Model" of the emergence of New Englishes. In the first part of the lecture, I will survey these achievements on the basis of illustrative case studies.

What has not been studied in equal depth (yet) are the non-traditional avenues for the spread of standard and vernacular varieties of English that have been opened up through more recent aspects of globalisation, such as the new migrations starting after the end of the Cold War, the entertainment industry or the revolution in communication brought about by the participatory web. Many of these phenomena elude description within the "Three Circles" of Kachru's model and require a re-positioning of World Englishes research in the context of the "sociolinguistics of globalisation" (Blommaert 2010).

Inhalte

Functionalism is usually understood to be in opposition to formalism in the description of grammar. The various versions of generative grammar are, to a strong degree, formalist, arguing for, for example, the autonomy of syntax, morphology, etc., the primacy of word classes like verb, adjective, noun and particle, and the exclusion of pragmatics.

In a functional grammar the focus is on what function a grammatical element may have in the various interacting components of a grammar as well as allowing for the interplay of pragmatic factors.

We will look at the ‘architecture’ and components (or ‘metafunctions’) in two major functional grammars: Dik’s functional grammar (FG) and Halliday’s systemic functional grammar (SFG). The latter, in particular, has influenced major descriptive grammars such as Quirk, Greenbaum, Leech, Svartvik (1985) *A Comprehensive Grammar of the English Language*.

The course is split into a lecture section for theory and a practical session for application of the theory.

Inhalte

The date 1066 may be the metonymic label for the political and cultural cesura caused by the Norman invasion of England. Hence, for over 200 years English largely disappeared as a written language in general and as the language of written poetry in particular.

The class will give a critical insight into the immediate as well as long-term cultural and – in particular – literary consequences of 1066 and the reemerging of English as a literary language after ca. 1200. The aim of the class is not so much to illustrate that English after all 'replaced' French but rather to show that, for one thing, English poetry very much profited from its French models. Moreover it will discuss how English poetry gained a standing in the 14th century that could compete with that of continental vernacular poetry.

Inhalte

Comparison between different languages and between different varieties of one and the same language is a central aspect of linguistic analysis. Such comparisons can be carried out for different purposes:

- Comparisons show whether two languages are closely related genealogically or not, i.e. whether they derive from a common ancestor. It is generally accepted that German and English are both Germanic languages, but it is currently debated whether English is more closely related to the Scandinavian languages than to the West-Germanic ones. (**Historical Comparative Linguistics**).
- By large-scale comparisons linguists try to investigate unity within diversity, i.e. the dimensions along which languages may differ from each other and the properties that are shared by many, most or even all languages (**Language Typology**).
- By comparing varieties of one language we can discover how much variation is possible within one language without calling its basic unity into question (**Microvariation**).
- By looking at the different use of similar linguistic means and the different encoding of similar functions in different cultures we learn about different communicative strategies and principles of language depending on the cultural context (**Intercultural Communication**).
- In comparing two languages, which may play the roles of mother tongue vs. foreign language in language teaching or as source language vs. target language in translation, linguists can at least contribute to creating new foundations for foreign language teaching and translation (**Contrastive Linguistics**).

Our lecture will provide introductions to all of these issues in language comparison, but will primarily be concerned with language comparison of this last type (and partly of the second type) and present a comprehensive and detailed survey of shared properties and major contrasts between English and German. In the course of this survey we will also briefly look at the relevant properties of languages represented in the audience by native speakers. We will avoid the excessive use of technical terminology and introduce the relevant distinctions as we go along.

Inhalte

This seminar will familiarize students with the basic concepts and terminology of Morphology, the study of the internal structure of words. We will start with the core areas of inflection, derivation, and compounding, and look at the processes that lead to the formation of words such as *untraceable*, *lipstick* or *pigeon-hole*, and discuss the relationship that holds between words such as *cat* and *cats*, on the one hand, and *dish* and *dishwasher*, on the other. A synchronic study of these and other phenomena in the domains of inflection and word formation will be covered as well as the phenomena of diachronic change, including analogy and grammaticalization. Particular emphasis will be put on the interfaces between morphology and syntax, and morphology and phonology, and it will be shown that linguistic processes often cut across different levels of language structure, and thus cannot be assigned to only one of the components of linguistic analysis.

Introduction to Linguistics.

Inhalte

This class offers a basic overview of phonetics and phonology, the branches of linguistics that are concerned with speech sounds and their use in linguistic systems. We will start out with an investigation of the physical aspects of vowels and consonants, addressing questions such as "how are different sounds produced?" and "what are their acoustic characteristics?". In addition to discussing these matters theoretically, students will also learn to directly measure these acoustic properties using the freely available software "praat". Via topics such as pitch/intonation, stress, connected speech phenomena, and the problems of automatic speech synthesis and recognition we will then gradually make our way into phonology. A comparison of different theoretical approaches in the field will be complemented by an analysis of syllable structures and sound inventories in the world's languages and in different accents of English. This Proseminar is thus potentially interesting for people who are curious both about purely descriptive issues such as British-American pronunciation differences, and more theory-related questions such as why talking to your phone works ok, but still leaves much to be desired.

This course examines the tense and aspectual systems of the English verb phrase.

We will look at the forms and functions of tense and aspect relying on functional grammar. The students will also learn about Aktionsarten, discover how tense and aspect play out differently in some non-standard varieties of English, and compare the English system with the German one.

Inhalte

This class will take a close look at a number of problematical issues in historical linguistics in general, and the history of English in particular. Apart from providing a general survey of the history of English as well as familiarising students with a range of methodological concepts in historical linguistics, this class will adopt a bottom-up approach to the study of historical phenomena. Specifically, the core of the seminar will consist of a “dissection” of one particularly prominent phenomenon of English history and historiography, namely the Great Vowel Shift (GVS). With the GVS as a phenomenological vantage point, students will be familiarised with various discourse patterns that relate to linguistic historiography in terms of a broad range of ontological and epistemic issues. This discussion will illustrate that the use of simplex labels such as “Great Vowel Shift” – and their associated “reality” in the shape of palatable textbook phenomena – does not do the complexity of the phenomena justice, while at the same time being useful heuristic conceptual devices.

Inhalte

This seminar will explore the impact of expectations and stereotypes (often subsumed under ‘top-down knowledge’) on language processing. Based on in-depth discussions of recent neuro-and psycholinguistic papers, we will see that language processing is not an ‘encapsulated’ and purely stimulus-driven ‘bottom-up’ process, but that it is shaped by experience-driven representations which are constantly revised and updated by incoming (linguistic and non-linguistic) input. Another aim of this class will be to analyse how current assumptions on the interaction between bottom-up and top-down processing can be accommodated in theoretical terms and to highlight theoretical challenges to current models.

In spite of (or sometimes even because of) these harsh beginnings, the region has developed a rich and diverse linguistic and cultural heritage, which we will approach in three stages:

- the emergence of the finely graded creole / English-continua which characterise the sociolinguistic landscapes of most Caribbean territories today;
- the international spread of creole linguistic resources through migration, youth culture and the entertainment industry.

Inhalte

This class looks at how phonetic variation is used by speakers to identify social categories (such as a given speaker's age, the place they grew up at, occupational status, and many other categories). We all do this: For example, if someone pronounces the German word 'kannst' with a palatal fricative instead of an alveolar one, most native speakers of German will (often unconsciously) deduce that said speaker must be from the South-West of Germany rather than, say, the North-East. Recent research in phonetics and sociolinguistics indicates that mappings between variation in the speech signal and social categories can be extremely complex, as well as being largely below the level of consciousness of both speakers and listeners.

This class consists of two interwoven components: Apart from familiarising students with the state of the art in recent sociophonetic research, the class also includes a practical component in order to put students in a position to carry out their own research projects. Thus, participants will be familiarised with the basics in instrumental phonetics using PRAAT as well as being (gently) introduced to stochastic data analysis using R.

In der FDÜ werden wir uns zunächst auf die fachdidaktischen und filmtheoretischen Hintergründe konzentrieren, um dann den Einsatz im Unterricht an konkreten Beispielen zu veranschaulichen. Im dritten Drittel erarbeiten die Studierenden Material und Ideen zu einem geeigneten Spiel- oder Kurzfilm, die dann den Schwerpunkt der Abschlusspräsentation mit Kolloquium bilden sollen.

In den letzten Jahren hat die Bedeutung des Mediums Film für den Fremdsprachenunterricht deutlich zugenommen. So wird ab 2015 erstmals ein *feature film* Teil des Pflichtkanons der Kursstufe in Baden-Württemberg sein. Die Gründe für den vermehrten Filmeinsatz im EU sind vielfältig: Sie reichen von einer hohen Schülermotivation durch affektiven Zugang über die Schulung des Hör-Sehverstehens (*native speakers* agieren in relativ authentischen Situationen) oder die audio-visuelle Vermittlung sozio- und interkultureller Inhalte, bis zu der Erkenntnis, Film als der Literatur gleichwertige Textsorte zu betrachten, die mit eigenen formalen Mitteln Inhalte transportiert. So sind der Filmeinsatz und die Vermittlung filmsprachlicher Grundkenntnisse nicht nur im Bildungsplan verankert, sondern sie bieten auch eine Chance für zeitgemäßen und schülerzentrierten Fremdsprachenunterricht.
