#### Inhalte

This lecture course will introduce beginning students to basic theoretical concepts of Cultural Studies, ranging from questions of representation to issues of class, gender, generation, race, cultural memory and the cultural meaning of space, among other topics. The outline of basic theoretical positions will be accompanied by an application of these concepts to practical examples in contemporary British or American culture.

The lecture course is accompanied by a voluntary tutorial ([Doing Cultural Studies](#)) for those who want to discuss the reading assignments outside of the lecture course. The tutorial is highly recommended for students who want to deepen their understanding of the material and get some additional practice for the final exam.

#### Lehrmethoden

This is a lecture, so there will be a large percentage of, well, lecturing, but I will try to include some activating methods every time. Besides the main lecture, student-taught tutorials are a part of the class. The tutorials – [Doing Literary Studies](#) – introduce you to the basics of using the libraries, and to doing bibliographical research there, as well as to various venues of such research. The tutors will also try to answer questions and provide in-depth information where the lecture could only provide outlines, or scratch the surface of topics.

#### Lernziele

Students will be enabled to do research, gather material, and write scholarly papers. They will gain the competence to analyse literary and other cultural artifacts, and to place them in their historical environment.

#### Inhalte

In this introductory class, students will be introduced to the tools of the trade of literary scholarship and literary research. We will touch the main genres of literatures in English, and introduce a variety of theories as well as methodological approaches to these literatures and other products in the cultural field.

**Inhalte**

This lecture explores the evolution of English poetry from the mid-sixteenth through the early nineteenth centuries in light of (early) modern ideas of subjectivity. It examines key poets, poetic forms, periodical characteristics, and social contexts. It will complicate standard narratives of the demise of rhetoric after the Renaissance and the rise of the subject in the novel (as opposed to poetry), highlighting transformations of the defence of poetic practice from Sidney's "Defence of Poesy" to Shelley's "Defence of Poetry." It discusses how poetry shapes newly emerging conceptions of the self, its rhetorical presentation, and its political limits, foregrounded by proto-feminism and abolitionism.

**Lehrmethoden**

Because the method worked well last year, we will try it again: flipping the classroom. From the Corona years, we have a series of lectures on video that I thought were good. So the first session in class will be live and serve as an introduction; after that we will meet Mondays to discuss and answer questions about the respective next lecture which you (and I) will have had time to peruse during the previous week.

**Lernziele**

Students should be able to make up their own minds after this class not just whether they like a particular text or not, but why and how so.

**Inhalte**

This lecture is designed to give students an overview of the most important developments in North American literatures and cultures from the revolutionary period to the present. The emphasis will be on an introduction of the main periods and genre concepts, among which are: the political pamphlet and early magazine culture, the rise of the short story, the American Renaissance, poetry from Frenneau to the Fireside Poets and Whitman, American Theater from melodrama to modernism, the American modern, the invention of a Canadian literature, the North American postmodern: trans-genre, trans-ethnic, trans-gender.

**Literatur**

There is no one anthology holding all the texts I will be looking at. *The Heath Anthology of American Literature* is a good starter kit, though.

Most of the pre-20<sup>th</sup> century texts are also online in one form or another.

**Inhalte**

Dark Academia is an aesthetic that has swept across social media sites such as Instagram and TikTok, and is characterized by a romanticization of the past and a fascination with academic life as well as the evocation of a dark and gloomy atmosphere. The trend is also intricately linked to literature since books – especially canonical works, such as Homer's epics and Oscar Wilde's *The Picture of Dorian Gray* – constitute essential components of the Dark Academia toolbox. Furthermore, the self-proclaimed 'dark academics' immerse themselves in contemporary literary works which both reflect and inspire the Dark Academia aesthetic.

In this class, we will engage with Dark Academia as a cultural phenomenon and discuss the literary works which feed into the trend. In this context, we will identify the characteristics of this relatively loose subculture and discuss it in relation to bibliophilic communities associated with social media platforms, such as BookTok and Bookstagram. We will also problematize the aesthetic's idealization of the literary canon and its privileging of Western culture. Finally, we will ask how social media trends and the book market are interrelated, and whether we are confronted with the emergence of a new genre: the Dark Academia novel.

We will start off by reading Donna Tartt's *The Secret History* (1992), which is considered one of the seminal Dark Academia texts. We will then move on to discuss contemporary novels which reflect, capitalize on, or are otherwise connected with the Dark Academia trend: M. L. Rio's *If We Were Villains* (2017); Madeline Miller's *Circe* (2018); Mona Awad's *Bunny* (2019); and excerpts from Alex Michaelides' *The Maidens* (2021).

This class also features a creative component: students will either create their own bibliophilic and/or Dark Academia-inspired social media content or analyze social media content of their choice by means of a creative written response.

**Lernziele**

The aim of this class is to gain insights into the genre of early modern prose romance and to be able to situate it in its cultural and literary contexts.

**Inhalte**

In this class, we will explore the genre of the prose romance, which was immensely popular during the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. They were widely in circulation well over a century before the novel started emerging and also provided inspiration for some of the most popular dramatists of the time.

We will start by reading Sir Philip Sidney's *Old Arcadia*, which was finished in 1580 and originally only circulated in manuscript for the amusement of his sister. In its rewritten version, the *New Arcadia*, Sidney's romance remained an influential bestseller well into the eighteenth century and continued to inspire other writers. One of the writers inspired by Philip Sidney was his niece, the Lady Mary Wroth, who was not only the first woman to write a complete sonnet cycle in English, but also the first female writer to pen an original work of prose fiction in English: *The Countess of Montgomery's Urania*, which we will also explore in this class. The third romance we will read is Robert Greene's *Pandosto* (1588), which is today best known for serving as an inspiration of Shakespeare's *Winter's Tale*.

Active group discussions, short written assignments and a brief presentation will prepare you for the final assignment: a term paper.

**Inhalte**

Mary Wollstonecraft, a founding figure of feminism and author of *A Vindication of the Rights of Women* (1792), and Mary Shelley, author of *Frankenstein* (1819) were mother and daughter. Yet they never got to know each other, because Wollstonecraft died shortly after her daughter's birth from an infection she contracted during childbirth. Both women were radical and free thinkers, both defied convention and fought for the right of women to shape their destiny and both suffered loneliness and abandonment. This seminar is dedicated to their literary legacy.

We will read some of their major works, and also attend to their journals, letters and travel writing. Additionally, the seminar offers an opportunity to engage with the historical, intellectual, and cultural contexts that shaped them and that have been shaped by them in turn.

Students interested in feminist studies, disability studies, posthumanism, life writing, Romanticism, sentimentalism, gothic fiction and post-apocalyptic novels will especially profit from this class.

This seminar offers a concise introduction to some of the hallmarks of transatlantic modernist literature. It highlights landmark poems such as T. S. Eliot's "The Waste Land" (1922) and three novels: James Joyce's Künstlerroman *A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man* (1916), the groundbreaking focalisation in Virginia Woolf's *Mrs. Dalloway* (1925), and Nella Larsen's critical exploration of racial *Passing* (1929). We will also discuss the drama, the short story, and the essay against the background of the momentous political and social changes in the wake of World War I and the advent of mass media such as cinema and radio.

### Inhalte

In recent times people all around the world are grappling with a series of parallel crises that are in some way related to how we move. Wars, climate change, urbanisation, and changing migration policies bring into focus the unequal capabilities for movement and unequal rights to stay or dwell in a place. But migration and mobility are not only divisive political issues – they are also prominent themes of literature and other cultural products, from postcolonial novels to speculative fiction imagining more just alternatives to the status quo.

In this course we will engage with the politics and power relations of migration and (im)mobility and their representation in contemporary literature. We will investigate examples ranging from novels to short fiction and film and discuss the ways they reveal and criticise social inequalities and how they imagine and articulate a different world.

There will be an additional session on June 6 **or** 7. Attendance is mandatory. More details will be given in the first session in April. To compensate those hours, 2-3 sessions during the semester will be devoted to self-study allowing you to work on prepping your written submission or term paper.

**Lernziele**

The goal of this seminar is to examine how works of short fiction tackle issues concerning identity formation, peer pressure, commitment to family and ethics as well as universal themes like love and loss. Students will train comprehension skills, their competence in textual analysis and literary theory. Plus, they will develop an awareness of the psychological dispositions, coping mechanisms, and mental resources that the protagonists display in these narratives. Students will be instructed to provide constructive feedback to other class participants.

**Inhalte**

This proseminar introduces students to a number of North American classics of this popular genre. It covers a wide range of stories spanning the 19<sup>th</sup> century to the present. The focus will be on the representation of powerful feelings such as grief, anxiety, trauma, ambivalence, a sense of loneliness as well as an elated feeling of happiness. Each week will be devoted to a different affective regime and how it plays out within the different protagonists and settings. There will be a cross-cultural component since the authors use their story worlds to reflect on different regional, racial, and gendered experiences.

**Inhalte**

A contested election dividing American politics; a wealthy, racist presidential candidate claiming to be the champion of the average American; book bans developing in the south; human rights for Indigenous, Black, and female Americans languishing amidst a threat of Civil War; a dark harmony resonates between events beginning in the United States in 1824 and the United States in 2024. Yet from 1824 through 1877, as the “Era of Good Feelings” ended with sharp division that was followed by Civil War and a fraught Reconstruction, some Americans imagined and fought (literally and creatively) to bring about an alternative to the America they had inherited. Creators of culture, especially on the margins, created new communities, developed new tales, or rewrote old narratives to ignite civic imagination and encourage change. This class will study important cultural moments and literary artefacts from America in this era in parallel with contemporary American events. What can be learned about democratic hope and an evolving American identity by studying a time that began, and ended, in division and chaos? How are current American struggles complicated by the struggles of this past era? Are there methods of resistance and strategies of cultural change that continue to be relevant?

**Content Warning:** Descriptions of racism, sexism, violence of all kind including gun violence, sexual violence, and other kinds of trauma will be recurrent in our readings and viewings.

**Literatur**

Readings will include some classics of American popular literature of the era from writers like Frederick Douglass, Ralph Waldo Emerson, and Louisa May Alcott; it will also include lesser-known literature such as William Apes's essay “An Indians’ looking glass for the White Man” (1833), the feminist stories of Franny Fern and the speeches of abolitionist Maria Stewart.

### Inhalte

This proseminar examines how movies project role models for both stereotypical and non-conforming gender performances. We will analyze representations of hegemonic masculinity (in Westerns featuring John Wayne), toxic masculinity (Robert de Niro in *Taxi Driver*), and black masculinity (Jamie Foxx in *Django Unchained*). Also, the different ways of acting out femininity will be assessed comparing movies from different eras and genres: drag and comedy in *Some Like it Hot* (1959), comedy-drama in *Transamerica* (2005). Also, we will investigate the visual strategies of the (female) gaze and the ways in which the normative regime of gender is subverted.

To participate in this class, a background in gender studies would be helpful but is not required. Students will be introduced to theoretical texts enabling you to gain critical media literacy and to better understand how actors and directors have constructed and deconstructed gender norms throughout American film history.

**Inhalte**

Currently the British television landscape is teeming with crime series featuring female police detectives – but this has not always been the case. In this seminar, we will trace the portrayal of female police officers on British television from their beginnings in the 1980s until today, focusing on a number of notable examples. In doing so, we will discuss structures of feeling and contemporary discourses around policing represented in these series. We will also analyze the role of the detectives' identity, with particular emphasis on the tension between gender performance and power dynamics within and outside of the police. Lastly, we will work within the context of television studies, considering affordances and characteristics of the medium, analyzing specific scenes from the series in detail, and exploring television's particular affinity with the crime genre.

**Inhalte**

The course will offer an overview of the main concepts in intercultural and cross-cultural communication. The lectures are built around a discussion of topics such as culture, language, society, and the relationship among them, with a focus on characteristics, differences and similarities of Western and Eastern cultures. Notions such as individualism vs. collectivism, independence vs. interdependence, social relationships, power, hierarchy, the education system differences, lifestyle, entertainment, spirituality, religious differences, and business relationships are among the discussed topics. Exchanges of views and information through personal experiences and lively discussions are welcome, which will be achieved by the presence of students from diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds. Comparison and contrast of opinions will help the students to raise their awareness towards different cultures. Alternative qualitative evaluation methods, including self-assessment questionnaires, interviews, and observation, will help students to reflect on their cultural identities, attitudes, perceptions, and cognitions.

**Inhalte**

'Drama in Education' or 'performative didactics' is a holistic approach to teaching with drama techniques in order to initiate or enhance learning processes in school. If the golden key of foreign language learning is improvisation, the beginnings are to master non-verbal techniques and to express yourself in the foreign language with few words but in a conscious and confident way. The integration of dramatic activities in the language classroom helps students to lose their fear of speaking freely and find a confident way of using their languages.

In this course we look at language acquisition from a theatrical point of view. What are the benefits of theater for language learning? How can we teach a language with the means of theater? What is performative language teaching and how does the role of the teacher change? How can we transform the foreign language classroom into a performative space of language learning?

### Lernziele

The goal of this seminar is to provide students with media competence enabling them to analyze techniques and genres using media, Black feminist, and Black queer theory. They will explore the various artistic strategies by which Black filmmaking has signified on U.S. cultural politics.

### Inhalte

Black media studies explores the connection between media culture and racial politics. It presents one of the most vibrant and longstanding areas of film and media studies. This seminar familiarizes students with the historic achievements in Black filmmaking ranging from Blaxploitation movies in the 70s to classics like Spike Lee's *Do the Right Thing* in the 80s and on to contemporary films with an all-Black cast such as Barry Jenkins' *Moonlight*. We will closely examine genre conventions and stylistic nuances in a Sci-Fi thriller (Ryan Coogler's *Black Panther*), independent queer film (Dee Rees' *Pariah*), historical drama (Lee Daniel's *Precious*; Ava DuVernay's *Origin*), and Jordan Peele's yet-untitled 2024 horror movie. Students will learn to analyze Black cinematic representations as well as a select number of paintings and song lyrics to examine how black media has challenged the onslaught of racial othering by deploying different visual and aesthetic strategies.

**Inhalte**

Since its 'invention' by Horace Walpole as a counterpoint to the eighteenth century's admiration for the rational, the gothic has always been used as a mode that explores a society's fears, in particular fears of powers that (seem to) go beyond or stand outside reason. The gothic negotiates cultural anxieties and taboo topics in order to explore ways of dealing with such fears.

In this course we will study gothic texts by British writers between the 18<sup>th</sup> and the 21<sup>st</sup> century. This overview of the (British) gothic genre will be accompanied by an exploration of different critical approaches that have been favoured for the study of the gothic, ranging from psychoanalytic criticism to urban studies and ecocriticism.

### Inhalte

This seminar explores the evolution of Shakespeare's comedies, examining three pivotal plays in chronological order: *A Midsummer Night's Dream* (c. 1595), *Twelfth Night* (c. 1602), and *The Tempest* (c. 1611). After a general introduction to Shakespearean drama, we begin our discussion of the comedies with an analysis of the use of the mythological supernatural in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. In *Twelfth Night*, we will examine gendered identity, alongside its motifs of love and revelry. The seminar concludes with *The Tempest*, which invites discussions of colonialism and ethnic identity amidst its comedy and romance elements. Our analysis will emphasise the differences between (dramatic) page and (theatrical) stage, deepening our understanding of Shakespeare's comedic techniques and their socio-cultural contexts.

**Inhalte**

This seminar will introduce students to selected works of dystopian fiction, Cli-Fi, and Eco-cinema. To better understand these fictional projections of (un)sustainable life worlds, we turn to eco-critical and eco-feminist perspectives. With a focus on Cultural Studies, we will tackle some of the following questions: How can cultural change move in the direction of sustainable development? What defines a “culture of sustainability”? How about the power dynamics at play? After all, the world’s richest 1% consume 25–30 times more than everyone else on the planet, whereas 4 billion people are emission-free.

Technology-oriented solutionists opt for renewable energy sources but will ultimately fail to make the planet more sustainable. It takes a holistic, system-thinking approach that integrates contributions from cultural, social, and political sciences, jurisprudence, philosophy, anthropology, geography, pedagogy and psychology. Since Cultural Studies has always been a multi-disciplinary field, it plays a vital role in building a culture of sustainability. Such a culture would inevitably build up “personal sustainability.” The asterisk in the title of this seminar signals that a cultural approach inadvertently acknowledges matters of diversity and mental health.

This seminar investigates the emerging transformations of the concepts of authorship and literary creation in the age of artificial intelligence. It revisits Kristeva's notion of "intertextuality," Foucault's "author-function," and Barthes's "death of the author" to critically examine how large language models challenge Romantic and modernist notions of authorship. We will engage with key texts from these theorists and bring them into dialogue with literary texts on the death of the author by human authors and AI models to conceptualise the evolving contemporary landscape of literary production.

**Lehrmethoden**

The course is task-oriented: all texts have tasks associated with them, which will be tackled by the students themselves in class. A thorough preparation of the set texts is therefore essential since this class will provide a platform to practice academic ways of thinking and argumentation.

Since all the texts are in either modern English translation or (very) late Middle English, they are relatively easy to read, so no thorough knowledge of Middle English is necessary.

How and in which contexts were women written by men in the medieval period, and how and about which topics did women themselves write? We are going to engage with the classical and medieval misogynist tradition, women's education and culture in the Middle Ages, the question of authority and authorship (authority of experience, submission and silence, appropriation and assimilation), as well as the tradition of women's writing in the medieval period more generally. Also, we are going to discuss approaches to medieval women's writing from a range of theoretical perspectives, including feminist approaches and gender studies.

- Summarize, compare and contrast main postulates of connectionist, instance-based and Bayesian approaches to learning theory;
- Apply a foundational machine learning algorithm (e.g., the delta rule) to language data.

**Inhalte**

Learning is the process of updating beliefs or changing behavior as a result of experience. Because some changes in belief and behavior given an experience are rational or adaptive – consistent with information provided by the experience – while others are not, the principles that govern learning are likely to be shared across domains of experience. Learning theory aims to discover these principles. For a long time, language acquisition was disconnected from learning theory because of Chomsky's rejection of behaviorism, the original approach to learning theory. Yet, the last thirty years have brought increasing realization that even if Chomsky is right about some knowledge of language structure being innate, this does not mean that beliefs about language are updated in special ways. The present class surveys the main approaches to learning theory, Bayesian, connectionist and instance-based, and how they have been applied to language acquisition.

**Inhalte**

This proseminar will introduce you to major linguistic contrasts between English and German. Even though English and German belong to the same language family, the West Germanic language family, and are thus typologically related, you probably know from your own experience as learners of English and speakers of German (or learners of German and speakers of English or learners of both languages) that there are notable differences between the two languages. In systematic contrastive analyses, we will take a closer look at these contrasts at different levels of linguistic analysis.

We will deal with phonological and phonetic phenomena (e.g. differences in the phoneme inventories of the two languages, e.g. 'final devoicing') before we direct our attention to morpho-syntactic and lexical phenomena. You will also apply your knowledge in practical exercises such as an analysis of tense and aspect errors in student writing. We will also look at how you can raise awareness for the mentioned differences in your student groups as a future teacher.

English is a global language, used not only as a native language but also as a second, official, and/or foreign language, or as a lingua franca in many places around the world. Today's learners of English will communicate with speakers of English from a variety of backgrounds, most of whom are not native speakers of well-known 'standard' varieties such as British and American English. In this seminar, you will first get an overview of the English-speaking world, the main models of World Englishes, and some of the semantic, syntactic, and phonological characteristics of post-colonial 'New Englishes'. Then, we will critically discuss the traditional approach to English language teaching, which targets the native speaker and standard language across all contexts of learning. We will suggest an alternative approach of teaching English as an international language. Moreover, we will discuss the relevance of World Englishes in the pedagogy of English in Germany, including attitudes, curricula, and learning materials.

In particular, we will focus on sound change, semantic change, grammaticalization, analogical change, and changes in constructional productivity.

**Inhalte**

What is language complexity? How can it be measured? What does it have to do with morphology and syntax? Why are some languages more complex than others? These and other questions will be discussed in this course.

Language complexity is a topic that has engaged researchers in linguistics for many years, and encompasses many different sub disciplines of linguistics (e.g. sociolinguistics, psycholinguistics, language typology, language acquisition, contact linguistics, ...). In this course, the focus is on language complexity and morphosyntactic variation both in English varieties around the world and in other, typologically diverse languages. In particular, we are going to cover the theoretical motivations for analysing language complexity, theoretical and practical issues of measuring language complexity, different methods to do so, and, last but not least, the potential sociodemographic and historical reasons for morphosyntactic variation in complexity.

**Inhalte**

Conventionally, English varieties are subdivided into three categories:

1. English as a Native Language (ENL)
2. English as a Second Language (ESL)
3. English as a Foreign Language (EFL)

Among the non-native categories, ESLs – typically associated with postcolonial states – are the varieties that tend to develop distinctive local norms, as a result of what Kachru (2005) called ‘indigenization’. Namibian English is an ESL variety with a long history as a prestige language but with only recent lingua franca status (one of the reasons why it has been considered an interesting object of study). Using contemporary data, we will look at how Namibian English developed and acquired specific features in the process. Three scenarios will be tested: One in which Namibian English forms the outcome of mutual convergence between ethnic English varieties, one in which it is marked by the normative primacy of the demographically strongest ethnolinguistic group, and one in which it is marked by the normative primacy of the initial English-speaking elites. After establishing which scenario applies most to Namibian English, we discuss how they apply to neighbouring countries, such as especially South Africa, and in postcolonial territories in general. We also discuss the inadequacy of some prevailing World Englishes models in accounting for the emergence of and variation in the postcolonial Englishes conventionally referred to as ESLs.

### Zu erbringende Prüfungsleistung

In this interactive course, students will choose a specific topic or construction and write a **seminar paper** about it. The paper can either be theoretical or empirical (i.e. corpus-based analysis using the [COCA/COHA](#)). To prepare for this paper, the students will have to do one smaller **assignment**, write a **paper proposal** and give a 10 min. **presentation** in which they present preliminary results.

Course evaluation is based on:

- 60% – Seminar paper
- 20% – Paper proposal
- 10% – Short oral presentation (*Impulsreferat*)
- 10% – Assignment

### Inhalte

For centuries linguists have had different points of views on what grammar is and how to model and formalize linguistic knowledge best. Moreover, they have different visions of how language is acquired and why it changes. For decades, there have been two opposing camps: functionalism and formalism. Additionally, in the 80ies, a third major school of linguistic thought emerged, which is rooted in the advances of cognitive science: a cognitive approach to grammar.

The aim of this course is to introduce the participants to one specific model: namely Usage-based Cognitive Construction Grammar. In Usage-based Cognitive Construction Grammar, which shares many of its assumptions with Cognitive Grammar and many functional models, language is an emergent ‘Complex Adaptive System’ that is shaped by domain-general cognitive processes. Language is grounded in language-independent cognitive processes such as association, automatization, schematization and categorization. Structure emerges through repetition, analogization, and categorization rather than resulting from a pre-existent matrix. In other words, constructionalists subscribe to a non-nativist approach which does not assume the existence of a universal grammar. Everything about language is learned and grammar is usage-based. Grammatical code is meaningful and functional but constantly changing. Categories are fuzzy and linguistic knowledge is organized in networks of constructional nodes.

By reading and discussing seminal literature together, we will find out what is meant by the statements above and what Construction Grammar, for example, has to say about first and second language acquisition, diachronic change, morphology, phraseology and idioms or abstract categories. In short, the course introduces the ‘Westcoast-Eastcoast’ (nature vs. nurture) debate, the ‘cognitive usage-based turn’ in grammar description (Cognitive Linguistics /Cognitive Grammar) and basic tenets and commitments of Construction Grammar.

**Inhalte**

Linguistic study and research increasingly demand sophisticated statistical methods –but this doesn't have to be intimidating or require a math degree! In this tutorial, we'll cover what you need to know to analyse linguistic data of different types (such as corpus, questionnaire, phonetic and experimental data). Specifically, we'll focus on the linear regression model framework, covering generalised model types like logistic and Poisson regressions and, towards the end of the semester, state-of-the-art mixed effects models. Throughout the course, we'll focus on interpreting models and visualising their predictions. We'll also cover how to best write about models using reproducible documents which update when the underlying data changes, thus allowing you to not only document your methods and analysis but also to keep track of your interpretations of the data.

Unlike in some other countries, German universities often do not specifically teach graduate students about how to think critically, but expect the student to acquire these skills "as they go along". This course is aimed at addressing this through this stand-alone unit, helping create an awareness of how we think, what bias, premises and assumptions are presented to us in argumentation, what we should do or look for when presented with or presenting arguments, and how we can think optimally.

By the end of the course the student should be able to take any argument and analyse it critically using the toolbox covered in the course, regardless of whether this text is in English or another language.

### Inhalte

This course will look at aspects of critical thought such as:

- Rhetoric
- Argumentation (and false argumentation)
- Analysing evidence and justifying opinions
- Technology and fake news
- Bias and assumptions

### Literatur

Reading and exercises from a variety of sources will be made available in printed form and on ILIAS. Reading assignments are to be completed as preparation.

### Inhalte

In den letzten Jahren hat die Bedeutung des Mediums Film für den modernen Fremdsprachenunterricht deutlich zugenommen. Seit 2015 sind *feature films* (bisher: *Gran Torino*, neu: *Arrival*) Teil des Abitur-Schwerpunktthemas der Kursstufe in Baden-Württemberg. Die Gründe für den vermehrten Filmeinsatz im EU sind vielfältig: Sie reichen von einer hohen Schülermotivation durch affektiven Zugang über die Schulung des Hör-Sehverstehens (*native speakers* agieren in relativ authentischen Situationen) oder die audio-visuelle Vermittlung sozio- und interkultureller Inhalte, bis zu der Erkenntnis, Film als der Literatur gleichwertige Textsorte zu betrachten, die mit eigenen formalen Mitteln Inhalte transportiert. So sind der Filmeinsatz und die Vermittlung filmsprachlicher Grundkenntnisse nicht nur im Bildungsplan verankert, sondern sie bieten auch eine Chance für zeitgemäßen, kompetenzorientierten und schülerzentrierten Fremdsprachenunterricht. In dem Seminar werden grundlegende filmtheoretische Hintergründe erarbeitet, deren fachdidaktische Umsetzung jeweils an konkreten Beispielen veranschaulicht wird.

**Inhalte**

**Organisation:** This one-week excursion is jointly organised by Prof. Barbara Korte and Prof. Christian Mair.

**Travel:** You are expected to organise your own travel to and from the UK. **The “official” programme will start in London on 22 July 2024, 5 pm and end in Exeter on 28 July 2024, 10 am.** Please consider these dates when planning your trip to and from the UK. If you require a visa to enter the UK, apply early, as the process will take time.

**Cost:** We will raise subsidies for part of the cost, but you should expect to contribute ca. 500 € from your own funds.

**Programme:** We will divide our time between London, a cosmopolitan metropolis, and Devon and Cornwall, which we will explore from Exeter. The latter region is a remote and generally rural part of England, though there was an important mining industry in some places. These now have to reinvent themselves after the closure of the mines. The details of the trip are currently being worked out, but to give you the general idea, the programme will feature the following elements:

- **Academic visits** (Queen Mary University, London; University of Exeter) that will enable us to consult with renowned experts on relevant aspects of sociolinguistics, multilingualism and British cultural studies;
- **London highlights:** exploring transformation/gentrification in London's historic East End; British Library; postcolonial London (Windrush Square, Kenwood House); theatre;
- **Devon/Cornwall highlights:** Exeter Cathedral; Tintagel Castle; Paignton or Dartmoor National Park; Eden Project.

In London, half a day will be set aside so that students visiting London for the first time get a chance to see their own priority sights.

**Preparation:** Study trips work best with groups that are well prepared and active. This is why we will arrange two meetings during the 2024 summer term. We encourage participants to take active roles in the preparation of programme points that have a high priority for them.
