Inhalte

Culture is all around us and shapes us. This lecture provides students with a better understanding of how cultural expectations, values, and practices impact our personal behavior and our society at large. Cultural Studies is the discipline that systemically analyzes cultural values and hierarchies. Since its inception in the eighties, this academic field has taken the term “culture” as ever-evolving and inclusive to examine a wide range of cultural practices and artifacts ranging from (indigenous) poems to (Hollywood) blockbusters. This lecture course will approach a number of practices and media representations through critical concepts such as identity, discourse, or ideology. We will also examine the asymmetries of power and privilege related to one's class, racial, and gender identity.

What is the difference between watching a movie and analyzing it? How does an eco-friendly outlook on the world and nature differ from the dominant Western worldview? These are questions that we will explore in this lecture. The course is designed as a general overview and introduction to Cultural Studies through the lens of US-American culture. It will introduce students to a set of theories and methodologies that they can apply to analyze cultural objects. Among these theoretical approaches are popular culture studies, film studies, critical media studies, and environmental humanities.

Inhalte

The lecture offers an introduction to the central literary and critical theories, focusing especially on their development, theoretical premises, methods, and consequences for the study of literature. Starting with the history of poetics, the lecture covers all major 20th- and 21st-century theories including New Criticism, Formalism, Structuralism, Narrative Theory, psychoanalytical approaches, Marxism, New Historicism, New Materialism, Feminism, Gender/Queer/Trans* Studies, Ecocriticism, Posthumanism, and Critical Race Theory. Students will learn to critically reflect on the various literary theories and develop an understanding of how they interrelate or differ from one another and what their respective epistemological interests are.

Inhalte

The course covers all major genres and seeks to understand North America as a multiethnic, multi-religious, and multiregional nation. The lecture provides a survey of the key texts, epochs, and developments in North American literature and culture. It moves from the Age of Discovery, Exploration, and Settlement (15th-17th centuries) to the Revolutionary Era and the literature and culture of the Early Republic (18th and 19th centuries), through the American Renaissance and the literature of reform in the middle of the nineteenth century, up until the periods of Modernism and Postmodernism (with an excursus into Realism and Naturalism) and concludes with recent ethnic literatures.

With such a wide historical range, the lecture can only provide an overview. Some of the authors covered include: Christopher Columbus, Sir Walter Raleigh, Thomas Paine, Thomas Jefferson, Alexander Hamilton, Benjamin Franklin, Royall Tyler, Phillis Wheatley, Frederick Douglass, Harriet Jacobs, Ralph Waldo Emerson, Henry David Thoreau, Edgar Allan Poe, Walt Whitman, Emily Dickinson, Harriet Beecher Stowe, Mark Twain, Henry James, Kate Chopin, Charlotte Perkins Gilman, Ezra Pound, T.S. Eliot, Gertrude Stein, Ernest Hemingway, F. Scott Fitzgerald, Langston Hughes, Zora Neal Hurston Richard Wright, Ralph Ellison, Sylvia Plath, Allen Ginsberg, Toni Morrison, Louise Erdrich, and others.

Please note that this will be a reading-intensive course.

Literatur

The required and suggested readings will be provided on ILIAS. There is no single anthology containing all the texts, but *The Norton Anthology of American Literature* collects many of them. As a recommendation for a literary history to assist your learning and reading, consult Richard Ruland and Malcolm Bradbury's *From Puritanism to Postmodernism: A History of American Literature*.

Inhalte

Since I am retiring at the end of this semester, this is my last chance to present a survey of narrative theory, outlining both basics for beginners and recent developments and the state of the art for more advanced students. The course will include an introduction to the narratological models of Gérard Genette and Franz Stanzel as well as focusing on important contributions by Seymour Chatman, Susan Lanser, Wolf Schmid, Monika Fludernik and David Herman. A brief historical conspectus of narratological study will be provided as well as a survey of postclassical narratologies. Some of the major issues treated will be those of the definition of narrative/narrativity, the contrast between factual and fictional narratives, historical vs. diachronic narratology and the use of narratological analysis in conversational narrative, feminist and postcolonial study.

Lehrmethoden

This is a lecture, but there will be room for Q&A and theatricals.

Lernziele

A survey of the roles and functions of theater and drama in North America, from the beginnings to the present.

Inhalte

North American Drama arguably started with the first indigenous inhabitant enacting something for an audience to accompany a narrative, or perform a ritual. We will take it from there, via French and British colonial dramatic efforts, to the first American Theatres, and their difficulties establishing themselves in a rather non-theater-friendly environment. One focal era often overlooked will be the 19th century with its touring troupes from Europe, minstrelsy, circus, (sensation) melodrama, musical, and vaudeville. Then on to the sports arena, to the little theaters and experimental stages of the 1910s and 20s, the WPA's Living Newspapers, the 'plastic' theatre of the 1940s, and the street and guerrilla theater of the 1960s.

Lehrmethoden

Active group discussions, short written assignments and a brief presentation will prepare you for the final assignment: a term paper.

Lernziele

The aim of this class is to gain insights into the genre of early modern prose romance, in particular the pastoral romance, and to be able to situate it in its cultural and literary contexts.

Inhalte

This seminar offers an introduction to early modern prose romances, one of the most popular genres in the sixteenth and seventeenth century. We will explore how the texts strike a balance between entertainment, rhetorical craftsmanship and didactic aims and situate the works in their historical, cultural and literary contexts.

We will start by reading Sir Philip Sidney's *Old Arcadia*, an Elizabethan pastoral romance that remained an influential bestseller well into the eighteenth century and continued to inspire other writers. One of the writers inspired by Philip Sidney was his niece, the Lady Mary Wroth, who was not only the first woman to write a complete sonnet cycle in English, but also the first female writer to pen an original work of prose fiction in English: *The Countess of Montgomery's Urania*, which we will also explore in this class. The third romance we will read is Robert Greene's *Pandosto* (1588), which is today best known for serving as an inspiration of Shakespeare's *Winter's Tale*.

Inhalte

Monsters are popular. Their cross-media appearances and the continuous prominence of fan favourites such as the werewolf or the vampire in today's culture(s) attest to this claim. Moreover, many of 'our' monsters have predecessors in medieval and ancient sources.

In this seminar we will explore monstrous figures and discourses on monstrosity in the medieval period. Inhalte

In this seminar students will learn to closely analyze novels, films, essays, documentaries that center around LGBTQIA-identities. Among the topics that we will explore through textual analysis are homophobia, coming-out, patriarchy, desire, intersectionality, pride, kinship, rebellion, transvisibility and queer ecology. While a number of theoretical concepts (e.g., performativity, queer phenomenology) will be introduced, this proseminar is primarily devoted to analyzing films and narratives that focus on the US American context. We explore the many ways of artistically expressing non-conforming gender and sexual identities. Thereby students will gain a better knowledge of the representational strategies by which artists have fought against anti-queer sentiment.

Lehrmethoden

This course also features a creative component: students signing up for this class will write a short retelling of a myth of their choice as part of their *Studienleistung*. This exercise will allow us to gain a better understanding of the practice of retelling and the choices it involves. The students will then analyze each other's work and provide constructive feedback in a double-blind peer review.

Inhalte

The twenty-first century has seen a surge of retellings, many of which center on the women of Greek and Roman mythology. These texts use as their sources the various versions of myths which have come down to us from antiquity, a period whose own literature frequently re-uses antecedent material. In this class, we want to explore these contemporary examples of retold myths, examine their retelling techniques, and probe the appeal of what has become a genre in its own right: the mythological retelling.

Students will be introduced to a range of theoretical approaches and concepts in adaptation and (classical) reception studies. Additionally, the course provides an overview of a number of contemporary literary genres and forms, scrutinizing texts ranging from Margaret Atwood's *Penelopiad* and Madeline Miller's *The Song of Achilles* to short stories and poems by Carol Ann Duffy and others, as well as a performance of a Greek tragedy.

Inhalte

The Twentieth Century, especially the second half, has been described as the 'second Elizabethan age' of drama -- another high point of dramatic development and experimentation. Inhalte

Plants are an omnipresent but usually rather subtle element of our daily lives. They can be decorative objects, crucial parts of our diet or present in more abstract ways, for example as materials in manufactured goods. In literature and popular media, they are frequently represented but often reduced to carrying symbolic meaning or appearing for aesthetic purposes. But the widely assumed passivity of plant life has also inspired a broad variety of literary and cultural products in which supposedly harmless plants are re-imagined as something that carries a hidden potential – something unexpected, threatening, or even subversive.

Plants with extraordinary qualities like healing herbs, magical beans or poisonous fruit are part of longstanding literary traditions and even more 'active' plants can be found in texts across centuries, be it in the form of bewitching flowers, man-eating trees or creepy, strangling vines. In this seminar, we will consider a variety of texts and popular media that represent plants in manifold ways: from fairy tales, poetry, and early science fiction to contemporary film and video games. We will discuss how certain fears, desires, hopes, and anxieties are projected onto various forms of plant life and how both silent and communicating plants can be seen to speak from and to certain cultural moments.

Please note that one of our sessions will take place in co-operation with a seminar on feminist horror. You will have the opportunity meet and exchange ideas with students from other disciplines like gender studies or cultural history. More details on this co-operation will be available before the beginning of term.

This seminar is designed for 6 ECTS.

Inhalte

Against the risk of being accused of witchcraft or a disease of the uterus ("hysteria") and treated accordingly, women over the course of America's development have fought for their own human rights. This course will examine historical texts and cultural representations of these struggles, investigating the different meanings available to an "American Woman" over an evolving history. We will consider the following types of questions: How have women created room for themselves in American culture and politics? How have they advanced the democratic goal of making America a place "with liberty, and justice for all?" How has this progress been advanced or complicated by issues of race, religion, and polarized political climates? How does the contemporary American cultural and political landscape reflect this history of contested women's progress? This seminar is designed for 6 ECTS.

Content Warning: Descriptions of racism, sexism, violence of all kind including gun violence, sexual violence, and other kinds of trauma will be recurrent in our readings and viewings.

Our analysis will take us through representations of American female heroes such as Pocahontas and Nelly Bly, texts such as the poetry of Phyllis Wheatley and early and contemporary feminist writings by authors like Judith Sargent Murray and Roxanne Gay, as well as modern expressions of this struggle represented in the artistry in tv/film and music/music videos expressed by popular artists like Taylor Swift and Janelle Monae. Inhalte

Jack the Ripper has been haunting the cultural imagination for almost 150 years. Since the Whitechapel murders in 1888, the Ripper has become a cultural myth and has been discussed, represented, and sensationalized countless times in culture and media, from press reports to podcasts, from Gothic novels to Hollywood movies to pop songs. Depictions cover a wide range of genres and ideological positions and have evolved into different viewpoints over the last century. These representations of Jack the Ripper, the victims, and the Victorian East End thus also display changing discourses around class, gender, and crime.

In this seminar, we will consider a number of fictional and non-fictional instances of the Ripper and his legacy in media and culture from the 1880s to the 2020s, including in contemporary newspaper accounts, short fiction, a graphic novel, film and television productions, video games, and true crime explorations. In doing so, we will trace how the Ripper myth interacts with different sociohistorical and -cultural viewpoints on poverty, misogyny, and deviance, will contextualize them theoretically, and will consider the ways in which media and genre affordances can offer a variety of different portrayals of the same phenomenon.

Inhalte

Theaterpädagogische Methoden und Arbeitsweisen haben im schulischen Alltag inzwischen einen sehr anerkannten und wissenschaftlich nachgewiesenen bedeutsamen Stellenwert erlangt. Das gilt einmal natürlich für die klassische Schultheater-AG, zunehmend aber auch für den Fachunterricht (insbesondere im Deutsch-, Literatur- und Fremdsprachenunterricht) und die fächerübergreifende Projektarbeit. Theater macht Schule? Ja! Denn theaterpädagogische Methoden bieten die Möglichkeit, Heterogenität zu nutzen, Sprache und Handeln zu verbinden, das soziale Miteinander zu fördern, spielerisch Lerninhalte aufzubereiten und mit Spaß erfolgreich zu vermitteln. So werden sie zur Grundlage gelingender Bildungsprozesse und der Förderung sozial-kommunikativer, handlungsfördernder und personaler Schlüsselkompetenzen.

In dem Seminar erforschen wir gemeinsam den Spielraum Schule und erkunden, wie man Unterricht performativ und bewegt gestalten kann. Dabei schöpfen wir aus einer inspirierenden Zusammenarbeit zwischen Lehrer:innen und Studierenden und nutzen die aus der Kooperation zwischen Universität (Nadine Schlockermann) und ZSL Freiburg (Peter Rauls) entstehenden Synergieeffekte.

Kommentar	<p>Combining history, literary studies, and cultural studies, this seminar, offered jointly by the English Department and the History Department, focuses on nineteenth and twentieth century literary representations of American travel and tourism to/in Europe as well as the historical discourses and developments they reflected and shaped. We will discuss questions of (self)discovery, national identity (or its limitations), commercial exploitation and transatlantic power. As an example that demonstrates the complex situation of American authors writing from and/or about Europe, consider this passage from the African American author James Baldwin:</p> <p>In my necessity to find the terms on which my experience could be related to that of others, Negroes and whites, writers and non-writers, I proved, to my astonishment, to be as American as any Texas G.I. And I found my experience was shared by every American writer I knew in Paris. Like me, they had been divorced from their origins, and it turned out to make very little difference that the origins of white Americans were European and mine were African – they were no more at home in Europe than I was (Nobody Knows My Name, 1961, pp. 17-18).</p> <p>Whether they identify as temporary tourists on “the grand tour,” fugitives on the run from unjust persecution, soldiers, expatriate modernist writers, postwar leftist internationalists, or cosmopolitans, American writers have visited Europe for many different reasons. The first half of the seminar will focus on tourism and travel in literature prior to 1900. Among the writers whose work we will read and discuss are Frederick Douglass, Mark Twain, Louisa May Alcott, and Henry James. As more “recent” modernist and postmodernist writing, in the second half of the seminar, we will read writers such as Ernest Hemingway, Edith Wharton, James Baldwin, Susan Sontag, and Ben Lerner.</p> <p>Das Abgabedatum für die Hausarbeit ist der 01.04.2024. The most important narrative form of Middle English literature is the romance. It includes a wide panoply of forms and subjects, from Arthurian themes and Celtic myths to the exploits of Alexander the Great and adventurers travelling to the East. Knightly battles and love stories are intertwined. We will use both the original texts and an edition with translated tales. Among the romances we will read are the two early romances set in Britain, *King Horn* and *Havelok the Dane*, the lai *King Orfeo* (a rewrite of the story of Orpheus), the story of friendship of *Amis and Amiloun* and the love story *Floris and Blancheflour*, among others.

There are several underresearched fields in British as well as North American Literatures, but few have remained as unduly neglected to this day as the so-called 'Oriental Tales' that filled the pages of British and American magazines in the late 18th and early 19th century. Concentrating our efforts on this period, we will try to reconstruct where the fascination with the orient, long decried as the arch-enemy of Christian civilization, came from, as well as assess the role, function, and importance these stories had in their time. We will look at a variety of cultural transfer phenomena, adaptations, as well as misinterpretations and outright fakes. And then there will be the question why, and how, they disappeared almost completely from cultural memory.

Inhalte

Ancient texts exerted a pervasive influence on Latin and vernacular literature during the Middle Ages and early modern period. This seminar will examine examples that illustrate this historically contextualized and multifaceted ‘impact’. Our main focus, however, will be more theoretical and revolve around a comparative analysis of the scholarly approaches and paradigms that so far have been developed to study the reception of ‘classical’ texts. Specifically, we will investigate the extent to which decolonial perspectives have been incorporated into existing approaches, and how the parameters of a ‘critical reception history’ can be delineated. On the seminar, we will be studying works by Aby Warburg, E.R. Curtius, E. Auerbach, H. R. Jauss, and a range of more recent authors. Each session will be devoted to a theoretical approach in dialogue with examples from medieval to contemporary literature.

Inhalte

This seminar introduces students to a number of distinguished works that are written in a colloquial and speakerly style. The vernacular literary tradition has an indistinguishable aesthetics and it, intentionally or unwillingly, pushes a political agenda. This course covers a wide range of novels spanning three centuries of US American literary history. The focus of our analysis lies on how the (teenage) characters navigate and resist the power dynamic that determine their identity.

This course builds on the skill set you learned during the [Introduction to Literary Studies](#) since we will use narratological approach and critical media studies to continue training your skills in literary analysis. Please be aware that there is a heavy reading load for this seminar. You might want to get a head start reading some of these novels during your summer break before we meet at the end of October. But we will often devote two sessions to discuss one novel.

Inhalte

Trees and forests have been part of the way civilizations perceived of themselves since time immemorial. Forests can represent a source of danger, threatening civilizations, as much as a haven of innocence and personal recovery. With their life-span usually surpassing that of humans, individual trees can assume cultural status as connectors, as sites of memory or relics of an older (happier) time. Framed within ecocritical approaches, this seminar sets out to explore a variety of literary expressions (from poem to short story and essay) that focus on trees and forests. After considering some historical examples since the middle ages, we will focus on recent fiction to assess the status of trees and forests in the negotiations of current cultural concerns.

Inhalte

In his 1915 poem “On Being Asked for a War Poem” William Butler Yeats famously stated:

“I think it better that in times like these
We poets keep our mouths shut, for in truth
We have no gift to set a statesman right; [...]”

Just a year later, however, Yeats himself would attempt to “set statesmen right” with his famous war poem “Easter, 1916.” War is one of the oldest subjects of literature and poets have written about war, because of war and against war. In this seminar we read and discuss war poetry from Homer’s *The Iliad* to poems written about the wars of the twenty-first century. War poetry exists in multiple forms including nursery rhymes, sonnets, and free verse. It ranges from celebratory to critical, from autobiographical to satirical. The seminar takes a long view of war poetry but it has a focus on 20th and 21st century texts. Additionally, we will not only concentrate on the voices and experiences of soldiers, but also focus our attention on the voices of the families left behind and civilians affected by the conflict. As from the war itself until the late 1970s the genre of war poetry was almost exclusively reserved for male poets, this course will put a special focus on war poems by women.

Inhalte

British colonial expansion from the 17th century laid the foundations for the rise of English to the status of a world language. But when the British Empire had reached the high point of its power in the early 20th century, the English language was still just one of several competing world languages. Its further rise to the world's undisputed lingua franca during the late 20th and 21st centuries is therefore as important to study in its full complexity as the colonial legacy of English. The major linguistic and sociolinguistic trends will be studied with a view to assessing their cultural and political consequences. We will set aside time for the study of key source texts and hands-on practice in the use of language corpora and other digital resources available for research on English as a pluricentric language.

Lehrmethoden

This lecture will be accompanied by the practical class [Doing Linguistics](#), which utilises an online tool to provide interactive practice units that apply the weekly lecture content. Each unit can be repeated as needed until successfully completed, with progress being incremental—only after completing one unit is the next unlocked.

In the second half of the semester, the course includes six mandatory in-person sessions focused on empirical research methods. These sessions will cover the use of linguistic resources such as corpora and databases, effective strategies for scientific literature research, essential academic writing techniques, and guidance on developing a topic for a small empirical research project.

Attendance in this practical class is mandatory, as the coursework completed here will contribute to your overall grade in the module unit "Introduction to Linguistics."

To support the online learning process, there will also be a non-compulsory open office hour offered three times a week for 60 minutes. During these sessions, instructors will address topics that have proven particularly challenging for students, based on the outcomes of the online units. This is also an opportunity for students to ask questions about the units, current lecture topics, exam preparation, and general troubleshooting related to the tool.

Inhalte

This is the standard introductory lecture for English linguistics to be taken in combination with the practical class [Doing Linguistics](#). On the one hand, it will provide an introduction to the scientific study of language, covering key areas such as phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics, with a focus on contemporary English. You will be introduced to the basic terminology, major theories, and methods developed in linguistics, including important theoretical models like structuralism, generative grammar, and functional approaches.

On the other hand, the lecture will illuminate you on the distinctive properties of the (Standard) English sound system, vocabulary, and grammar, as well as the major contrasts between English and German. It also explores the geographic and social variability of English and its status as a world language.

Ultimately, this lecture should be understood as an exercise in linguistic consciousness-raising, aiming to reveal everything you always knew about language(s), especially English, but never dared (or cared) to ask.

By the end of this course, students will:

1. Discuss the features of oral versus written communication in creole communities;
2. Outline the basic grammatical structures that are shared by English-based creoles and standard English;
3. Judge the role of language in social interaction and the construction of identity;
4. Present logical arguments about World Englishes and the Caribbean language situation;
5. Critically analyse and evaluate linguistic features of both creole and English;
6. Talk about language in socio-political discourses and social systems in the anglophone Caribbean;
7. Synthesise information in comparing creoles and English;
8. Talk about the post-creole continuum and its function in understanding speakers of the Caribbean;
9. Write about the sociolinguistic atmosphere in the anglophone Caribbean;
10. Evaluate the validity and credibility of sources in supporting arguments about anglophone creoles and standard varieties of English.

Inhalte

Sociolinguistic features and communication styles of the general English speaking Caribbean

This introductory course Creole and English in the Caribbean is designed to give undergraduates a general understanding of the ways English-based creoles and English are utilised in the 21st century Caribbean. The

course is also designed to tap into and nurture students' critical thinking and analytical skills in understanding the complexities of both creoles and English. Additionally, the content of this course addresses the ideologies of language and power as important constructs for speakers of Caribbean creoles and English. The course is student-centred giving learners the opportunity to discover and learn new knowledge about the current models of World Englishes and the ways in which the sociolinguistic situations of the Caribbean fit into these models.

Since research done in the anglophone Caribbean draws many parallels as well as several differences among the creoles and their English lexifiers, this course is geared towards encouraging learners to use key concepts from these bodies of work as scaffolds for their thoughts, ideas, experiences and opinions when writing about the region. Students are placed at the centre of learning giving them the opportunity to initiate and invent arguments as well as to hone skills of scientific discourse in which they are engaged.

By the end of the course, students will have the tools to speak effectively about the similarities and dissimilarities of English-based creoles and English. Thus, gaining lifelong knowledge about communication in creole communities where a localised norm along with an endonormative standard is maintained. Skills learnt from engaging with materials from this course are essential for understanding how English is used in the 21st century outside of inner circle countries like Britain and America.

Cognitive aging in healthy individuals is often perceived as a process of general cognitive decline. This psycholinguistically oriented seminar aims to subject this ageist stereotype to critical empirical and sociolinguistic examination and to provide a more nuanced perspective on the effects of aging on language acquisition and processing. More specifically, based on overview chapters and recently published studies, we will explore how different facets of language learning and processing (e.g., reading, syntactic processing, interaction) evolve across the lifespan, examine underlying explanatory factors (reorganization of memory, increased world knowledge, sensory changes), and discuss potential influences on research outcomes due to certain assumptions and research settings. The seminar will also provide students with hands-on experience in conducting their own small-scale psycholinguistic experiments.

Linguistic determinism – the hypothesis that the structure of our languages shapes cognition and culture – was elaborated systematically by Wilhelm von Humboldt, Edward Sapir and Benjamin Lee Whorf, but has remained controversial. This is witnessed by a spate of recent publications such as Deutscher (2010) and McWhorter (2014), which have reached audiences beyond professional linguistic circles. In this seminar we will discuss the issue from a World Englishes perspective. Languages are disappearing fast while English is ever more strongly entrenched as the default lingua franca in academia and discourse on the “grand challenges” of global politics, such as human rights, sustainable development or climate change. Does reduced multilingualism in these domains mean that we are imprisoned in English (Wierzbicka 2014), or is the global language an appropriate vehicle for the expression of diverse cultural experience?

The corpuslinguistic working environment for the student of English continues to develop fast. New resources are made available every year, and annotation schemes and software for the retrieval, visualisation and statistical analysis of the data are becoming ever more sophisticated. In this situation, the workshop intends to provide a forum for students with interest in and, ideally, some previous experience, in the use of corpora who would like to:

- (a) hone their hands-on technical skills and
- (b) deepen their understanding of the methodological and theoretical issues arising from the use of corpora in linguistic description.

To keep things practical, I invite you to bring along your own raw data, so that we can work together to develop them into a proper corpus. Alternatively, you may be planning a project, such as a BA thesis, for which corpus methods might be useful.

Students need to **participate regularly** (i.e. no more than 3 missed sessions), complete the **readings and exercises**, and submit a **final data analysis project** (6-10 pages by **March 1, 2025**; note that you are able to work on this assignment during class).

Inhalte

In this class, you'll learn how to turn linguistic data into enlightening visualisations and summaries, and present those in professional presentations or documents. We'll start by introducing the programming language R, which helps automate working with and analysing data. Then, we'll discuss importing data from various sources and wrangling it (i.e., processing your data into the correct format for the subsequent steps). We'll learn how to create informative and well-designed graphs that visualise our data, as well as how to calculate and present descriptive summaries. Finally, we'll wrap up the tutorial by creating reproducible documents and presentations which update when the underlying data changes, thus allowing you to not only document your analysis but also to record your interpretations of the data.

Throughout the tutorial, we'll work with linguistic data of different types (such as corpus, questionnaire, phonetic and experimental data) in order to become familiar with their idiosyncrasies. The class will be entirely taught in the free, open-source programming language [R](#) (no prerequisite knowledge is assumed). It is accompanied by weekly readings and short coding exercises, and interspersed with practical, hands-on sessions, where students will be guided to work on their final projects if they require course credit.

Was sind typische Herausforderungen an die Übersetzer*innen von Unterhaltungsliteratur insgesamt (z.B. Umgang mit Schimpfwörtern, Sexszenen oder Körpersprache und Körperlichkeit)? Neben textbasierten Analysen aktueller englischsprachiger Gegenwartsliteratur sollen so auch Einblicke in die Arbeitsprozesse von Literaturübersetzer*innen und die Anforderungen an die Aushandlungsprozesse kultureller, sprachlicher und textueller Vielfalt gegeben werden.

Lehrmethoden

Over the course of the semester, students will create a portfolio of written content. Some of this will be discussed with and receive feedback from the instructor, but peer review will form an important mainstay of the class, with students working together to improve each other's writing, practice error analysis and give feedback appropriately; the results of this will then be further processed and developed in the portfolio. In-class activities will also include collaborative writing tasks, text comparison and analytical discussions of the kind outlined above. The primary mode of assessment will take the form of an essay written under exam conditions (2-4 hours) at the end of the semester, reflecting on an aspect of the culture- and/or media-related issues handled in the course of the semester.

Inhalte

This course offers students the opportunity to improve and expand their advanced writing skills while reflecting on a wide range of text-based resources suitable for teaching purposes. Content creation will form one strand of the class, with students producing texts in a range of contexts and genres, either as a response to a stimulus or working with a range of extant texts. Our topics will be drawn from the areas of culture(s) and the media, thus giving students the chance to work on their own intercultural and media competence as well as preparing them to pass on these central skills within the school curriculum. Examining, analyzing, evaluating and reacting to resources will form the basis both for the creative process and for the process of reflecting on texts in terms of how access to information and requirements of the genre, on the one hand, and the cultural preconceptions of the author, on the other, can influence the form, content and the kind of language that is used. The latter point also takes us in the direction of mediation (*Sprachmittlung*) and different stylistic registers.

Inhalte

In den letzten Jahren hat die Bedeutung des Mediums Film für den modernen Fremdsprachenunterricht deutlich zugenommen. Seit 2015 sind *feature films* (aktuell: *Arrival*) Teil des Abitur-Schwerpunktthemas der Kursstufe in Baden-Württemberg. Die Gründe für den vermehrten Filmeinsatz im EU sind vielfältig: Sie reichen von einer hohen Schülermotivation durch affektiven Zugang über die Schulung des Hör-Sehverstehens (*native speakers* agieren in relativ authentischen Situationen) oder die audio-visuelle Vermittlung sozio- und interkultureller Inhalte, bis zu der Erkenntnis, Film als der Literatur gleichwertige Textsorte zu betrachten, die mit eigenen formalen Mitteln Inhalte transportiert. So sind der Filmeinsatz und die Vermittlung filmsprachlicher Grundkenntnisse nicht nur im Bildungsplan verankert, sondern sie bieten auch eine Chance für zeitgemäßen, kompetenzorientierten und schülerzentrierten Fremdsprachenunterricht. In dem Seminar werden grundlegende filmtheoretische Hintergründe erarbeitet, deren fachdidaktische Umsetzung jeweils an konkreten Beispielen veranschaulicht wird.

Inhalte

Warum „teaching speaking“? Tun wir das nicht schon längst in unserem kommunikationsorientierten Englischunterricht und ist eine solche Veranstaltung nicht daher obsolet?

Dieses Seminar soll einerseits der Frage nachspüren was es braucht, um als Fremdsprachenlerner:in Sprechfähigkeiten zu verbessern und wird Methoden anbieten die dazu dienen können, sich der authentischen Sprache von *native speakers* schrittweise anzunähern.
